What is Improv?

Improvisational theatre is a form of theatre in which the actors use improvisational acting techniques to perform spontaneously. Actors typically use audience suggestions to guide the performance as they create dialogue, setting, and plot extemporaneously. Improvisational theatre performances tend to be comedic, although some forms are not necessarily intended to be comedic.

What is this workshop all about?

In this workshop, you will learn what improvisation is, how to prepare your mind and body for a scene, and the basics of improvisational theatre.
